GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- **32 units**, including **2 exploration terms** (one of which must be taken during the first year), with a minimum GPA of 2.0
- A **major** with a minimum GPA of 2.000
- **Explorations** general education requirements
- 1 unit in each of **four areas**: fine & performing arts, social sciences, natural sciences, and humanities (excluding EH 102, EH 208, and elementary and intermediate foreign language courses)
AP and IB credit may fulfill area requirements.
- 24 **College sponsored lecture and arts events**

 - Community Interest designated course (maximum of 2 count toward the 3 required) **CI**

Self-Direction

- 3 Courses outside of other general education courses and the discipline(s) of the major
 - Informal groupings of courses may be made available in advising or just by word of mouth
 - More formal groupings might be established in the future
