THE VULCAN

The Vulcan statue is the symbol of Birmingham, and it reflects our history involving the iron and steel industry. The statue itself is the largest cast-iron statue in the world, and you can even take an elevator or stairs up to the top to have a perfect view of Birmingham! At night, the Vulcan is lit up with a variety of colors to further highlight the nickname of Birmingham--the Magic City!

CONCERTS

SHOPPING


